Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to write to you one final time before we break up for summer to share with you some of the highlights of what has been an extraordinarily busy half term.

Firstly, fifteen students from across the school have received their certificates for the John Muir Award for 'connecting with nature', a very prestigious accolade in this field and a wonderful and worthy achievement. We have also had all of our year 10 and 12 students out on work placement and the feedback from businesses across the North-East has been extremely complimentary, from patisseries to hospitals and even our own school who were supporting some budding teachers.

Others stayed in school choosing from activities such as bridge building, film making, string art or competing in a chess competition - everyone had a well deserved great day! Moreover, fifty students and staff returned from an educational 4 day school trip to Belgium. They visited the battlefields of the Somme and Ypres and all returned safely, full of historical knowledge.

Finally, it is with great sadness that I have decided that this term will be my last as headteacher here at Teesdale School. Many of you already know that I commute a great distance every day to work in this wonderful place and it has been a huge honour and a privilege to do so. Serving the students, families and community of Barnard Castle has been an experience I will cherish forever. I hope you understand the very difficult predicament I faced when an opportunity to Lead on Secondary Teaching and Learning across the trust arose. I feel very fortunate that I will still have strong links to Teesdale School in my new role and will continue to support your children.
