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Dyslexia:

Dyslexia is a learning difficulty that primarily affects reading, spelling, and writing. It can also impact memory, organisation, and processing speed. Dyslexia is not linked to intelligence; many dyslexic individuals are highly creative and excel in problem-solving. With the right support and tools, children with dyslexia can thrive.

How to help your child

By providing the right encouragement, resources, and tools, you can help your child develop confidence and succeed in their learning journey. Here are some tips:

- Explore different types of reading material Comic books, graphic novels, and child-friendly newspapers can be engaging alternatives to traditional books.
- Make reading a family event, share in a book together.
- Always encourage and support your child as they learn, praise effort.

Use technology to assist learning - as many children with dyslexia prefer to work on a computer:

- Word processing programmes can be useful because they have a spell-checker to highlight mistakes in your child's writing.
- **Text-to-speech tools:** Many web browsers and programs include text-to-speech functions. For example, Microsoft Immersive Reader in Office 365 can read text aloud. Learn more here: **Microsoft Immersive Reader**
- **Speech recognition software:** Children with Dyslexia often have better verbal skills than writing and there are many free online tools that can convert spoken words into text.
